

**Robert R. Stewart**

*Professor of Geophysics  
University of Calgary  
Department of Geology & Geophysics*

Robert R. Stewart holds a B.Sc. in physics with a minor in mathematics from the University of Toronto and a Ph.D. in geophysics from Massachusetts Institute of Technology. His career has included positions with Chevron, ARCO, and Veritas Software - where he worked in research and as a processing geophysicist. Dr. Stewart held the Chair in Exploration Geophysics at the University of Calgary from 1987 to 1997 and is currently a professor in the Department of Geology and Geophysics. He is also President of the geophysical consulting company, Gennix Technology Corp.

Dr. Stewart was awarded Honorary Membership in the Canadian Society of Exploration Geophysicists in 2004 and, in 2006, Lifetime Membership in the Society of Exploration Geophysicists (Tulsa). Dr. Stewart was the inaugural SEG Distinguished Educator in 1999 and conducted a speaking tour of thirteen countries affiliated with the SEG. He is a past editor of the Canadian Journal of Exploration Geophysics and was an associate editor for GEOPHYSICS. He was awarded the CSEG Medal in 1992 and was president of the CSEG in 1997. Dr. Stewart is Director of the CREWES project, a university-industry research consortium of twenty-six companies studying advanced seismic methods for resource exploration. Robert has led geophysical expeditions to study Maya ruins in Belize, Central America as well as impact craters in the Canadian High Arctic as part of the NASA Haughton-Mars Project.
